The proposal of John N. Murphy to superintend the re-building of the centre division of the State Tobacco Warehouse No 2 in the City of Baltimore, and the making of such other repairs as may be found requisite to put the said Warehouse in complete repair, accepted, and upon the said John N. Murphy giving Bond with the penalty of ten thousand dollars with security to be approved by the Governor, for the faithful performance of said work and for the application of such funds as may be advanced to him for the purchase of materials and payment for the necessary Labour in said re-building and repair, - Ordered that the Clerk of the Council draw on the Treasurer of the Western Shore in favour of the said John N. Murphy immediately for two thousand five hundred dollars, and that the said Murphy in the execution of the said work consult with the State inspectors of Tobacco from time to time in relation thereto, and report his progress to the Executive at every meeting until the said work is finished.

Ordered that the Armoury at Easton be authorized, under the direction of General Potter, to have the repairs made to the shed attached to the Armoury authorized by Resolution No 58 of the last General Assembly.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council the following civil appointments were made, and commissions issued accordingly viz,
