Thursday May 9th 1833.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to George Brown on account of Richard of having unlawfully and knowingly sent to one Nicholas Worthington a certain letter subscribed with the letters B.L. threatening therein him the said Nicholas Worthington to kill and murder with a view and intent a certain great sum of money to wit the sum of eight hundred dollars, from him the said Nicholas Worthington, the said then to tort and gain to the great damage of him the said Nicholas Worthington, to the evil example of all others in like cases offending, and against the peace, government and dignity of the State, pending against him in Battinow County Court.

Monday June 3rd 1833.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order two hundred and ninety one dollars thirty one cents for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard Anderson or order three hundred and sixty dollars for one year and a half pension from the 5th of October 1831 to the first of April 1833.

Tuesday June 4th 1833.

Thursday June 6th 1833.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order twenty five dollars eighty one cents for the purchase of firewood, to be accounted for.

Tuesday June 18th 1833.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Gales Keaton or order twenty dollars for two years subscription to the daily National Intelligence, from the 6th of March 1832 to the 6th of March 1834, to account.
