and John T. Hodgart Esquire, in the eighth district, were duly elected members
to represent this State, in the Congress of the United States. A concise copy of the
following Proclamation was issued as directed by Law.

By His Excellency
James Thomas, Governor of Maryland
A. D. 1800. O. C. L. A. M. A. T. J. A. N.

Whereas by an Act of the General Assembly of this State
passed at the November Session eighteen hundred and five, entitled "An Act
to reduce into one the several Acts of Assembly respecting elections, and to
regulate said Elections," it is directed that the Governor and Council
after having received the returns of elections of members to represent this
State, in the Congress of the United States, shall enumerate and ascertain
the number of votes given for each and every person voted for, as members
of Congress aforesaid, respectively, and shall thereupon declare by
Proclamation, signed by the Governor, the name or names of
the person or persons duly elected in each respective district.

And an Election having been held on Monday the Seventh
Instant, agreeably to Law, in the several Congressional Districts, for
members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States,
as aforesaid, and the returns of said Election having been received,
and the number of votes given for each and every person voted for, as
members of Congress aforesaid, having been enumerated and ascertained
by the Governor and Council, we do by this our Proclamation
declare that by the said returns, it appears that Littleton Perkins
Esquire, in the first district; Richard B. Carmichael Esquire in
the second district; James Turner Esquire, in the third district;
James P. Hoath Esquire, in the fourth district; Isaac McKim
Esquire, in the fifth district; William Josh Johnson Esquire, in the
sixth district; Francis Thomas Esquire, in the seventh district; and
John T. Hodgart Esquire, in the eighth district, were duly elected
members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States.

Given under our hand and the great Seal of the
said State, the 24th day of October in the year
of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty
and of the Independence of the United States, the
fifty eighth.
