 charge and command you, that on or before twelve of the Clock on Friday

 Negro, from prison, and her safely convey to the gallows in the County
 aforesaid, the place of the execution of Male factors, and there the said
 Lucia Chase, Negro, hang by the neck until she be dead. For all
 which this shall be your sufficient power and authority.

 Pharo Bank to be kept in their house and inducing persons to
 gamble at said Bank, which was pending against them in
 Frederick County Court.
