

Saturday December 14th 1833.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John
Brown Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf & Dumb
the sum of \$1000.00 in honor of said Institution for the Deaf & Dumb
in token of support of the people of the State of Maryland, from
the first of April to the first of October last.

Sunday December 17th 1833.

The following was considered by the calling of the Governor,
upon the Command and information and evidence therein mentioned,

The State of Maryland of the Sheriff of Baltimore, or any
other County, in any State or Territory. Whereas, it appears from authentic
documents, certified and transmitted to the Executive Department of
this State by his Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of
Pennsylvania, that a certain Joseph Brennan late of the County of
Lancaster in the said State of Pennsylvania, stands charged, by
Indictment of a Grand Jury in the Court of General Quarter Sessions
of the peace of the said County, with the crime of wilfully and
unlawfully causing to be set up and played at for money, a certain
game of cards and hazard usually called a Roulette, and that
the said Joseph Brennan, has fled from the Justice of the said State,
and is now believed to reside in the City of Baltimore in this State.

And whereas the said George Wolf Governor as aforesaid,
hath in pursuance of the authority given in such cases, by the
Constitution and Laws of the United States, demanded the said
Joseph Brennan of the Executive of this State, as a fugitive from
Justice, and appointed Samuel Fisher his agent to receive the said
fugitive, and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania, for
trial for the said offence. Now therefore I James Thomas
Governor of the State of Maryland, have thought proper, in
compliance with the said Demand, to order and direct the surrender
of the said fugitive, and do hereby order and direct that you
forthwith, arrest and deliver the said Joseph Brennan, in his
within your bailiwick, to the said Samuel Fisher agent as aforesaid,
whenever the said agent first paying all cost of the arrest and detention
of the said fugitive. — for all which this shall be your sufficient
Warrant.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State
of Maryland, this seventeenth day of December in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three
and of the Independence of the United States the fifty eighth.
