By the petition of Doctor Absalom Thompson, and a transcript from the
Records of Talbot County Court, it appears that the said Absalom Thompson was
fined by the said Court the sum of fifty dollars for practicing medicine without a
License. The petitioner represents that in the year eighteen hundred and twenty
five, he graduated in the science of Medicine and Surgery at Harvard University,
and in 1826 obtained a Diploma from said University, that immediately after
obtaining said Diploma he returned home to his native County of York in
this State, and before entering upon the practice of Medicine or Surgery he sent
by his brother Anthony C. Thompson his Diploma to Easton to Doctor Truman
Thomas, the President of the Board of Examiners for the Medical Society of the
Eastern Shore of Maryland, and had his Diploma deposited with said Doctor
Thomas to be laid before said Board; that Doctor Thomas did not return
to the petitioner his Diploma for several years; neither did said Thomas
notify him that it was absolutely necessary for him to obtain a License
from said Board before entering into the practice of Medicine and
Surgery, till after he returned said Diploma, that he did then obtain
from said Board a temporary License till the annual Session of the
said Board, and then obtained Regular License; that after all the said
proceedings he was presented to the Grand Jury and fined the sum of the
Law for having removed the arm of a young Gentleman at the shoulder
joint, before obtaining License. He therefore prays for relief from said fine
And two of the Judges of the said Court having recommended a remission
of the said fine, we do hereby remit the same.
