Tuesday December 31st 1833 The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

John N. Murphy's account for rebuilding the Centre Division of State Tobacco Warehouse No 2 was examined and passed, and the following order on the Treasury given him for the balance due him thereon.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John N. Murphy or order six thousand five hundred and four dollars forty one cents, the balance due him for re-building the Centre Division of State Tobacco Warehouse No 2, after deducting six thousand five hundred dollars advanced on that account - of an amount examined and passed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George G. Brewer or order four hundred and ninety five dollars for recording Proprietary Leases, under Resolution of the General Assembly, of an amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order six dollars twelve cents, viz for expenses incurred in carrying Death Warrants to Baltimore, \$5.50, and for a Lock and two Door Mats 62 cents, of an amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William McMeir or order sixty dollars for fouling in blank for the Executive, of an amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Daniel Hart or order eight dollars twenty five cents, viz for binding and ruling a Record Book for the Adjutant General \$8, and for two Shuffles for the Court of Appeals \$4.25, of an amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John S. Zeiber or order forty six dollars for publishing in his paper several acts of Assembly, by direction of the Clerk of the Council, under an order of the House of Delegates, of an amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Candee or order seventy five cents for 2 Lt Sperm Candles, of an amount allowed.
