On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council Charles Waters was appointed one of the Commissioners of Potomac and Anne Arundel County, vice Stewart who declines accepting.

Thursday January 30th 1834

The Honorable Thomas M. Mezey member of the Council absent this day appeared in the Council Chamber and qualified as a member of the Council, before Edward Dubois Esquire, a Justice of the Peace of Potomac and Anne Arundel County, by taking the oath prescribed by the Constitution and laws of this State, and repeating and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion.

In Council Chamber, Jan 31 1834

Gentlemen of the Senate & of the House of Delegates:

We lay before you a communication from the President of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, with a copy of the Seventh Annual Report of the President and Directors to the Stockholders of the said Company; and also a report of the said Company for removing people from the said Company.
