The State of Maryland, to wit:

Whereas, in compliance with a Demand of His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, Orders have been given for the surrender of a certain John Wilson as a fugitive from the Justice of the said State, to Emmon Elliott Esquire, agent duly appointed to receive the said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania; it appearing from authentic Documents transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, that the said John Wilson stands charged on oath with having committed the crime of fornication and bastardy in the said County of Franklin. Now therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State, to let the said Emmon Elliott Esquire, agent as aforesaid, pass upon the fugitive un-molested to the said State of Pennsylvania, and that the said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner, and using no improper severity, or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner.
