On the Nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the
advice and consent of the Council, the following Military appointments were
made and commissions issued accordingly, viz

Lt Colo. Noadear H. Smith Colonel. Nic. Billingsly, who did not report
Major William Clare Lt Colonel. Nic. Smith promoted
Capt. William Smith Major. Nic. Clare Ltto.

By the petition of Adam Sigler of Allegany County, and
a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears
that he was fined by the said Court at October term 1833 the sum of five
hundred pounds, for going out of the County of Allegany where he resided
into the State of Pennsylvania to celebrate the unity of Marriage between
George Bram and Malissa Davis who reside in Allegany County
aforesaid, without License or publication as prescribed by Law. The
petitioner represents that he was at the time of celebrating said Marriage,
and is now, a Minister, within the meaning of the Law, being a reticent
life without any knowledge of the said Law, and that he had no
intention to violate that or any other Law of the State, and having acted
contrary to the said Law from utter ignorance of its enactment, he
prays that the said fine may be remitted. And two of the Judges of
said Court, and many respectable Citizens of the said County, having
recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner - do
hereby remit the said fine.

By the petition of George T. Brown, of Bruce's Forge
