Friday February 28 1834

The Council met Pursuant the same as yesterday.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Charles Keagy of St. Mary's County, a warrant of discharge pending against him by indictment in Saint Mary's County Court of official misconduct as a Justice of the Peace.

His Excellency also this day granted a Pardon to Isaac Keagy on account of passing counterfeit Bank Notes, of which he had been convicted in two several cases, in Baltimore City Court at February Term 1833, and for which he had been sentenced, in each case to five years confinement in the Penitentiary, also a Nolle Prosequi to the said Isaac Keagy on account of passing counterfeit Bank Notes, for which he stood charged by indictments in four several cases in Baltimore City Court.
