

The State of Maryland, to wit: Whereas, in compliance with a
Demand of His Excellency John Floyd, Governor of the State of Virginia, orders
have been given for the surrender of a certain Noble Peas, a fugitive from the
Justice of the said State, to Francis Hollinghead agent, duly appointed to receive
the said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Virginia: it appearing
from authentic documents certified and transmitted to the Executive Depart-
ment of this State, that the said Noble Peas, stands charged in the Circuit
Superior Court of Louisa, for Henrico County, in the said State of Virginia, with
Felony, and that he broke open the Jail of the said County, on the night of
the eighteenth day of January last. Now therefore, I James Thomas
Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons
within this State, to let the said Francis Hollinghead, agent as aforesaid,
pass with the said fugitive unmolested to the said State of Virginia; he
the said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner,
and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said
prisoner.
