

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Miller or order twenty seven dollars & 24/100 for printing notices and three dollars for freight and charges and 5/100 of amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Miller or order seventy five dollars twenty five cents, viz, \$40 for publishing in his paper Sunday papers by direction of the Clerk of the Council in virtue of a Resolution of the General Assembly, \$11 for publishing three Proclamations by order of the Executive, \$3 for publishing order of the Adjutant General relative to Militia officers reporting and \$21.25 for his paper for eight years and 5/100 of amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard O Bayly or order two dollars for publishing in his paper notice of the Adjutant General for Militia officers to report, of amount allowed.

By a transcript from the Record of Baltimore City Court it appears that Edward Fisher was fined by the said Court at October Term 1833, the sum of ten dollars for assaulting and beating George J. Dorney.

The said Court afterwards recommended the remission of the said fine and stated that they have no reason to believe its collection at this time will be oppressive. We do, therefore, remit the said fine
