

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William
or order receipt two dollars & fifty cents viz \$2.50 for printing four Substitutes, \$14.50
for packing same \$11.40 for banking and postage of same and \$1 for mending
the State flag & for mending the hall yard, & for putting lock on the door
& for mending door in the hall for mending of same amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John
a silver or order for one hundred and eighty eight dollars eleven cents for one
year ground rent on the Western Shore in 1834 & 1/2 up to the first day of August
next.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William
O'Neill a silver or order for two dollars for mending in blank and for
printing copies of Resolutions for members of Congress, amount
allowed.

Monday March 17 1834

The following Command was made upon the State of William
Grant Chief Judge of the Circuit Court for the District of Columbia for
the reason therein named as follows for and Justice upon application
and the information and evidence therein mentioned being filed in
the Executive Department viz.

To the State of William Grant Chief Judge of the
Grant Court of the District of Columbia, in case of William
and John Abbott and charged by his own confession, voluntarily
made before James George Esquire Mayor of Alexandria
with many others a Horse from the State of Prince Georges
County in the State of Virginia and the information has been received
at the Executive Department of this State that the said John
Abbott has fled from Justice and is now confined in Jail in
Alexandria in the said District of Columbia on account of said
offense. And it being important and right to pay for the good
of the State the said John Abbott being a Horse brought to
Justice at Prince Georges County in the State of Maryland by the
authorities and by the Constitution
and Laws of the said State do hereby demand and require that the
said John Abbott as a fugitive from the Justice of this State and make known
to your Excellency and show up the same. Henry Thompson Esquire
Attorney at Law Executive Council Agent to receive the said
fugitive and bring him to this State having jurisdiction of the said offense
that he may be brought to trial hereof.

In compliance with the requisition of the Law I herewith
have and produce to your Excellency a copy of the evidence
upon which the demand is founded which I certify is
