Wednesday May 14 1834.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay Elizabeth Shinnors or order thirteen dollars fifty cents for six months Salary for cleaning the Public Temples, due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay Richard Anderson or order one hundred and twenty dollars for six months pension due the first of April last.

The Council met Regularly in Justice Present

The following writs of Election were this day issued. Viz  
The State of Maryland, To the Sheriff of Dorchester County  
greeting: Whereas by the death of Littleton C. Dennis a vacancy has  
arisen in the Representation of this State in the House of Representatives of  
the United States. And whereas the Constitution of the United States  
provides that upon the happening of such vacancy in the Representation  
of any State the Executive authority thereof shall issue writs of Election  
to fill such vacancy and the laws of this State requiring that the  
Warrant or Warrants for such Election shall go to the County or Counties  
where the Election is to be held. And therefore, We do in  
pursuance of the authority and direction aforesaid, authorize and  
command you to appoint a day for holding an Election in your County  
of Dorchester, for a Representative in the Congress of the United States  
to fill the aforesaid vacancy of which said day, you must give  
at least, ten days notice (exclusive of the day of notice and day of  
Election), and we further command you to serve a copy of this  
Warrant, together with notice of the day you may appoint for holding  
the
