

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry J  
Sexton or his agent in dollars fifty seven and 5/10, Publishing Secretary  
of the same, by direction of the Clerk of the Council under Order of  
the House of Delegates, amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William  
Turbin or his agent sixteen dollars fifty four cents for the transportation  
of arms from Baltimore to the army at Frederick, amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas  
H. Letcher or his agent one hundred dollars and amount of interest for Colonel  
H. Letcher and Captain Gallager in virtue of a Resolution of the  
General Assembly, the accounts for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore deliver to Henry  
Hoy and Moses L. Linton or their order the piece of six pound Iron  
Money with the features lately sent to him by the Treasurer at  
Annapolis for that purpose.

The respective Bonds of Joseph Owens Keeper of the  
Penitentiary and of William H. Hanson a Director and member  
of the Executive Committee were laid before the board and examined  
and approved.

His Excellency the Governor having received notice agreeably  
to law from the President of the Frederick and Woodborough Turnpike  
Road Company that the said Road was ready for inspection as far as  
the River Monocacy, nominated and appointed Horatio G. Wall, John  
Fisher and John L. Harding Esquires, three Skillful and Judicious persons  
to view and examine the same and report to him in writing whether the said  
Road is so far executed in a masterly and workman like manner, according  
to the true intent and meaning of the Act of incorporation of the said Company  
and Commission issued to them accordingly. (See Turnpike Road Book)

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to  
Kinan Pickering on account of Murder in which he was convicted  
in Allegany County Court at October term 1829 and for which he  
was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years. (See Pardon Book)

His Excellency also granted a Pardon to Levin Stebens  
on account of Stealing of which he was convicted in Dorchester County  
Court at April term 1834 and for which he was sentenced to the  
Penitentiary for two years.
