

His Excellency also granted a warrant to summon P. H. H. on account of Stealing a Grey Horse, of which he was convicted in Baltimore County Court, at April Term 1834, and (See Warrant Record).

Thursday May 22nd 1834

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James B. Green or order Twenty nine dollars for publishing Sunday Laws of the last Session, by direction of the Clerk of the Council, in the mess and order of the House of Delegates, & account allowed.

Monday May 26th 1834

Horatio G. McCall, John Topley and John Harding Esquires, commissioners appointed to examine and report to the Governor, whether the part of the Frederick and Woodsborough Turnpike Road represented to be completed and ready for inspection has been finished in a workman-like manner, according to plan, having reported in the affirmative, His Excellency the Governor issued his License to the said Company, as directed by Law, authorizing it to receive the tolls allowed by its charter for passing thereon. Ordered that the Clerk of the Council be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed, upon receiving from time to time, when the Council may not be in Session, certificates of the Joint Committee of the Library of the Sums of money required for defraying the expenses of fitting up the new Library, to draw upon the Treasurer of the Western Shore for such Sums as may be so required, not exceeding thirteen hundred dollars.

Returns having been received from the several Counties composing the first Congressional District, of the Election held on the twenty ninth ultimo for a Representative in Congress for the said District, to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of Littleton P. Dennis Esquire, the board proceeded to enumerate and ascertain the number of votes given for each and every Person voted for as a member of Congress as aforesaid, when it appeared that John V. Steele was duly elected to fill said vacancy - whereupon the following Proclamation was issued as directed by Law viz
