His Excellency the Governor granted the following Pardons & Prolonged Prosecutions

To John Remy on account of charge pending against him by Indictment in Frederick County, of passing a counterfeit note knowing the same to be counterfeit, a Prolonged Prosecution.

To William Nicklas a Pardon, on account on account of an appeal & Writ upon George W. Parrott, for which he was convicted in Talbot County Court, at May Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to pay a fine of twenty dollars, and be imprisoned in the Jail of Talbot County for three months.

To Samuel Smith, alias Carner, alias Scott, on account of Stealing a Horse, for which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at June Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years, a Pardon.

To Charlotte Pughman, free Negro, a Pardon, on account of Stealing, of which she was convicted in Talbot County Court at May Term 1834, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Pardon Record).
