Ordered that Treasurers of the Western Shore pay Richard D. Wells or order sixty two dollars fifty cents, for one quarter salary as Steward to the Governor, due this day.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay Julius J. Queate or order five hundred dollars for one quarter salary as Geologist, due this day.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay John H. Alexander or order five hundred dollars, for one quarter salary as Engineer, due this day.

Ordered that the Treasurers of the Western Shore pay William Durbin or order seventy five dollars, for one quarter salary as Announcer at Frederick, due this day.
