

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Charles
or order thirty one dollars for publishing Sunday Laws by direction of the Clerk of
the Council, in virtue of orders of the House of Delegates, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Isaac Hume
or order fifty three dollars, (viz \$38 for publishing Sunday acts & penalties, by
direction of the Clerk of the Council, in virtue of orders of the House of Delegates,
\$1 for publishing notice of Proposals for Stationary and \$2 for publishing a
Proclamation of amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Perennial L
Boyd or order fifty dollars for balance due him for Super-intending the
re-covering of the State House, and repair of the Dome, & amount allowed.

Friday August 8 1834.

The Council met & present the same as on yesterday.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and
with the advice and consent of the Council, Edward S. Moore was appointed
an additional Justice of the Peace of Anne Arundel County, and Commission
issued accordingly.

The proposal of Elijah Wells for building a Gun House, upon
the second plan submitted by Mr Robert C Long, was accepted, with the
condition, agreed to by Mr Wells, that the Executive pay him the \$500
appropriated by the Legislature, and that he look to the Legislature for
the balance of the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars - the
work to be done under the superintendance of Mr Long. Ordered that
the Clerk of the Council enter into a written contract with Mr Wells
upon said terms.

Mr Bowie submitted the following Preamble and
Resolutions viz Whereas it has been represented to the Executive,
that several criminal prosecutions instituted in the Baltimore Criminal
Court, have, upon the suggestion of the parties accused, been removed
for trial to Harford County, and the prosecuting Attorney for Baltimore
has applied to the Executive to direct that the Attorney General
shall attend for the purpose of aiding in the said prosecutions. And
whereas from the highly important nature of the cases referred to, and
the great pecuniary interests of the State involved in the transactions
ought of which they grow, the Executive feel themselves called on to comply
with the request of the prosecuting Attorney - therefore, Be it Resolved by
the Governor and Council of Maryland, that the Attorney General
be and he is hereby authorized and required to attend in person at the
