Wednesday October 8th 1834

The following order was signed by His Excellency the Governor
upon the demand and information and evidence therein mentioned viz.

The State of Maryland, To the Warden of the Jail of
Baltimore County, Greeting. Whereas, it appears from authentic documents
certified and transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, by
His Excellency John Davis Governor of the State of Massachusetts, that
a certain William (Jesse) late of Boston in the said State of Massachusetts
having been by the affidavit of John Conist with having feloniously
stolen, taken and carried away from the city of Boston in the said State,
Bank Bills and Silver coin of the value of four, three thousand dollars
of the goods and chattels of the Suffolk Bank, at Roxbury and that the
said William (Jesse) has fled from ^{the} Justice of the said State, and is now
confined in Jail in the city of Baltimore. And whereas the said John
Davis Governor as aforesaid hath in pursuance of the authority given in
such cases by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, demanded
the said William (Jesse) of the Executive of this State, as a fugitive from
Justice, and appointed James Peirce his agent to receive the said fugitive
and transport him to the said State of Massachusetts for trial for the said
offense. Now, therefore I James Thomas, Governor of the State of
Maryland have thought proper in compliance with the said demand,
to order and direct the surrender of the said fugitive, and do hereby order
and direct that you forthwith deliver the said William (Jesse) if he
is in your custody to the said James Peirce agent as aforesaid, the said
agent first paying all costs of the arrest and detention of the said fugitive
for all which this shall be your sufficient warrant.
