

Monday December 8 1834

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order eighty dollars and ninety one cents for the purchase of firewood to be accounted for.

Wednesday December 10th 1834

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order twenty three dollars fifty four cents for the purchase of firewood to be accounted for.

Tuesday December 16th 1834

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to John Carter Cook on account of Felony, of which he was convicted in Washington County Court at November Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

His Excellency also granted a Volle Prosequi to Willy Bowery and Charity (sister) free Negro's on account of a charge of stealing a Hog for which they were recognized to appear and answer before Frederick County Court.

Saturday December 20th 1834

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one hundred and ninety four dollars ten cents for the purchase of firewood to be accounted for.

Tuesday December 23rd 1834

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to William E. Moran, on account of Felony of which he was convicted in Charles County Court at August Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

Wednesday December 24 1835

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Sketcher or order nine hundred dollars for Swords for Colo Towson and Captain Gallagher by direction of the Executive, under Resolution of the General Assembly.

Andrew Kershner, William C. Drury and John Reynolds Esquires, commissioners appointed to view and examine the Turnpike Road from Williamsport to Hagastown, and to report to His Excellency the Governor whether the said Road is extended in a masterly and workmanlike manner according to the true intent and meaning of the act incorporating a company to construct said Road, having made their report, in writing, in the affirmative His Excellency the Governor this day issued his License authorizing the said Turnpike Company to receive the Tolls allowed by its charter for passing thereon.
