

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard Wilks or order sixty two dollars fifty cents, for one quarters salary as Steward to the Governor due this day.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council Thomas S. Gray was appointed an additional Justice of the Peace of Worcester County, and Commission issued to him accordingly.

By the petition of Randolph Shipp and a transcript from the Records of Anne Arundel County Court, it appears that the said Shipp was fined by the said Court at April Term 1834, the sum of twenty dollars for an assault upon James Mitchell. The petitioner states that he done no injury to the said Mitchell, that he acted on the defensive altogether, that he merely pushed said Mitchell when he approaching the petitioner with a cane in his hand, that being entirely ignorant of Court affairs and advised to submit the matter to the Judges, and not knowing that it was necessary to produce evidence in the matter, - which he could have done, - by which his innocence would have been substantiated, and being in indigent circumstances and having a family of small children dependant upon his exertions for support, and being the first time he has ever been implicated in any thing like a breach of the peace, - he prays for a remission of the said fine. And sundry respectable Citizens of said County having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, and stated that they know him to be a hard working, industrious man, that he is poor and has a large family with an aged mother dependant upon him for support - we do hereby remit said fine to said the same is payable to the State.

Upon application being made to His Excellency the Governor by Richard McGill Esquire Deputy Attorney General stating that in consequence of an application from several Citizens of Anne Arundel County to the Honourable the Judges of Baltimore City Court, sustained by affidavit stating that the public peace and quiet of the County had been greatly interrupted by a large body of armed, riotous and tumultuous men, that two murders of a most atrocious character had been recently perpetrated, and that the civil authority was believed to be unequal to the arrest and detention of the parties concerned in said outrageous conduct, that the Honourable the Chief Judge of the said Court ordered the Militia of the City of Baltimore, in conformity with the Act of Assembly to aid the civil authorities of Anne Arundel County, that thus re-inforce the Magistrates of Anne Arundel County, to discharge their duty, and from the necessity of the case, the same
