

for the trial of all the offenders — His Excellency thereupon
issued a special commission of Oyer, Terminer and general Jail delivery
directed to the Honorable Thomas B. Dorsey, Chief Judge, and the Honorable
Charles J. Kilgour and Thomas H. Wilkinson associate Judges of the
Judicial District of this State, authorizing and requiring them to hold a Court
at the City of Petenapolis on _____ and from thence by
adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary for the trial of the aforesaid
persons, and all other crimes, offences and misdemeanors whatsoever that have
arisen or may arise in the said Courts, and for the delivery of the Jail of said County
of all the prisoners confined therein charged with any crime, offence or misdemeanor
or whatsoever.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William
Newnam or order eight hundred and forty eight dollars forty seven cents for
balance of his account for clearing and repair of tuns, (after deducting one
thousand and fifty dollars advanced on that account) under Resolution
of the General Assembly, of amount allowed. —

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William
Newnam or order seventy five dollars for one quarter salary as announced
at Easton, due this day. —

The Council met Present the same as on yesterday
The Honorable Thomas W. Toaz also attended.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Mrs
Anne Levache or order forty dollars for one quarter pension, due the
first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay
Joseph H. Nicholson or order thirty seven dollars fifty cents, for one quarter
salary as Clerk of the Senate, due the first instant.

By the petition of Robert Crain and a transcript from
the Records of Charles County, it appears that the said Robert Crain
and Washington H. Lancaster had entered into a recognizance in the
sum of twenty dollars each, for the appearance of Negro Ben before
Charles County Court at August Term 1833 to answer such charges
as should be alleged against him, and that the said recognizance
had been forfeited. The petitioner states that the public did not suffer
by Negro Ben's failing to appear, as no one appeared against him, and
no presentment was found, he therefore prays for a remission of the
said forfeiture. And the said Court having recommended as follows
with the prayer of the petitioner, we do hereby remit the same.
