

The State of Maryland, to wit: Whereas, in compliance with a Demand of His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, orders have been given for the surrender of a certain above named James Grason as fugitive from the Justice of the said State, to Adam Eichelberger agent, duly appointed to receive the said fugitive and transport them to the said State of Pennsylvania: it appearing from authentic documents transmitted to the Executive Department of this State that the said above named James Grason stands charged by affidavit with having stolen one Bay Horse and one Bay Mare, the property of Henry Appleman, of the County of York in the said State of Pennsylvania. Now therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State to let the said Adam Eichelberger agent as aforesaid pass with the said fugitives unmolested to the said State of Pennsylvania: he the said agent conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner and using no improper severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner.

The State of Maryland, To the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore County, Greeting. Whereas it appears from authentic documents, certified and transmitted to the Executive Department of this State, by His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, that a certain person whose name is unknown stands charged by the affidavit of Peter New Patterson of the County of York in the State of Pennsylvania, with having stolen from the said Patterson, divers goods as also a sum of money, the amount of which is not ascertained, and part of which goods were found in his possession by Hays and Riggs peace officers in the City of Baltimore, and that the said unknown person has fled from the Justice of the said State, and is confined in the Jail of Baltimore County. And whereas the said George Wolf Governor as aforesaid, hath in pursuance of the authority given in such cases by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, demanded the said unknown person of the Executive of this State, as a fugitive from Justice, and appointed Adam Eichelberger his agent to receive the said fugitive and transport him to the said State of Pennsylvania for trial for the said offence. Now therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland have thought proper, in compliance with their demand, to order and direct the surrender of the said fugitive, and do hereby order and direct that you forthwith, deliver the said unknown person, if he is in your custody to the said Adam Eichelberger agent as aforesaid he the said agent first paying all cost of the arrest and detention of the said fugitive - for all which this shall be your sufficient receipt.
