

In the resignation of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, Richard Middleton was appointed architect of the place of the City of Baltimore, Vice Sir Edmunds died, and a new Commission signed accordingly.

By the petition of Michael Ferrall and a transcript from the Records of the same Court, it appears that he was fined by the said Court at the Chamber Term 1834, the sum of sixteen dollars, sixty six cents and two thirds of a cent for selling spirituous liquor without License. The petitioner states that he had requested a friend to procure License to sell liquor, and placed money in his hands for that purpose and that believing that his friend had procured this License he proceeded to sell believing that he was justifiable in so doing, that under these circumstances he prays to be released from the said fine, and two other days of the said Court, having recommended a remission of his fine, we do hereby remit the same. By the petition of Peter Williams and a certificate from the Mayor of the City of Baltimore County it appears that the said Peter Williams was fined by Baltimore City Court at June Term 1834, fifty dollars for a conspiracy, and sentenced to six months imprisonment also. The petitioner it appears had served on his said six months imprisonment, and he states that he has arranged by debtors' examination and in his detested circumstances in consequence of his inability to provide for his family, that he is unable to pay said fine, and therefore prays to be released therefrom. A remission of the fine was granted. The said Peter Williams guilty of said fine having recommended a remission with the prayer of the petitioner, we do hereby remit the same. James Thomas
