

Wednesday January 28th 1835.

His Excellency the Governor on this day granted a Pardon to Richard Burditt free negro, on account of receiving three bushels of stolen wheat, the property of John Morris, knowing the same to have been stolen: for which he was convicted in Frederick County Court, at Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for three years. (See Pardon Record)

Thursday January 29th 1835

His Excellency this day granted a Pardon to James Spedding free negro, on account of stealing and carrying away a quantity of firewood, the property of William Sankinson: for which he was convicted in Talbot County Court, at November Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Pardon Record)

Monday February 2d 1835.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Elizabeth Simmons or order six dollars seventy five cents for one quarter salary for cleaning the public Temple, due the first instant. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Writ of Habeas Corpus to George G. Cordery on account of a charge, jointly with William O'Sten, of having stolen from John Jones, two one hundred dollar Bank Notes, and thirty or forty dollars in silver, for which he was committed to the Jail of Baltimore County. Wednesday February 5 1835.

The following Order was made upon His Excellency George Wolf Governor of Pennsylvania, for the person therein named, as a fugitive from Justice, upon application and the information and evidence therein mentioned being filed in the Executive Department. Viz

To His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania. Whereas a certain Peter Sully negro stands charged by Indictment in Baltimore City Court, with having maliciously killed William Pratts negro. And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Peter Sully has fled from Justice and is now confined in Jail in Philadelphia. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of Society, that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to Justice. Now therefore I James Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby declare the said Peter Sully as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and make known to your Excellency that I have appointed Simon Hays, my agent to receive the said fugitive and bring him to this State, having Jurisdiction of the said offence that he may be brought to trial there for.
