By a petition of sundry respectable Citizens of Prince Georges County
and a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears
that a Recognizance was entered into by Lorenzo Ambrose in the sum of
one hundred dollars and Archibald Edmonston and John T. Grove in the sum
of fifty dollars each, which was forfeited by the said Court at November Term
1834. The petitioners state that Archibald Edmonston a surety in said
Recognizance is a respectable and aged citizen and very unable to pay said
forfeiture from his small and reduced means, that he has a large and helpless
family to support, and that if the payment of said forfeiture was enforced it would
subject both him and his family to great loss and perhaps suffering. They
therefore pray for a remission of said fine. And one of the Judges of the said
Court, having recommended a compliance with the prayer of said
petitioners, we do hereby remit said forfeiture.
