Saturday February 14 1835

The Council met, Present the same as on yesterday.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William M. Parlin or order fourteen dollars for Penknives for the Executive of amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay I. Hart & Franklin or order one dollar and thirty nine cents viz \$1.20 for a Coal Rod and two Tumbles for the Court of Appeals, and 19 cents for wrapping paper for the Assistant General of amount allowed.

Monday February 16th 1835

The Council met, Present the same as on yesterday.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Writ Procequi to Amos B. Wheeler on a wound of a charge, of having received three minkins and one Ham of Bacon knowing the same to have been stolen, which was pending against her by Indictment in Kent County Court. (See Parson Record)
