The Legislature having passed a Resolution authorizing
the Governor and Council to employ a Guard for the protection of the
public property, as a consequence of apprehensions entertained for its safety
the following Order was passed

Ordered that Captain Henry Cobbs be appointed Captain
of a Guard to be called into service for the protection of the public property
in the City of Baltimore, in conformity to a Resolution passed by the
Legislature this day authorizing the Governor and Council to call out not
more than twenty five men in such purpose.

Ordered further that Captain Cobbs be instructed to
raise twenty five Volunteers to act as a Guard for the City and designated
