By the petition of Jonathan Richart, and a transcript from the Records of Allegany County Court, it appears that he was fined by the said Court, at April Term 1824, the sum of fifteen dollars for retaining goods without license. The petitioner states that a certain James Murphy, a gentleman engaged in selling merchandise, in said County, made a contract with the father of the petitioner to let him have good goods to sell for one half the profits, and that the said Murphy agreed and promised to furnish a license, and to call at the Clerk's office and pay for said license, which he the said petitioner supposed he had done, until served with a writ at the instance of the State. He therefore prays for a remission of said fine. And the said Jonathan Richart having sworn said State-ment by his affidavit, and sundry respectable citizens of the said County, having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the said petitioner, we do hereby remit the said fine.
