Annapolis, March 6th 1835.

Gentlemen of the Senate, and  
of the House of Delegates,

We herewith submit for your consideration,  
a communication from the Honorable Lewis Cass, Secretary of War,  
with a copy of an act of Congress, passed at its recent session, for the  
continuance and repair of the Cumberland Road, by which it will be  
seen that a part of the sum appropriated by the second section of the  
said act, can be expended in the repair of the said Road, east of the  
River Ohio; until the same shall be surrendered to, and accepted by,  
the States, respectively, through which said Road passes.
