

upon consideration of the Resolution of the General Assembly authorizing the Governor and Council to contract for the repair of the State Tobacco Warehouses in the City of Baltimore, the following Resolution was adopted and passed.

Resolved that Nathaniel M. Williams Esquire be, and he is hereby authorized to contract with Wm. M. Murphy for the said Murphy to superintend the repair of the State Tobacco Warehouses in the City of Baltimore, as mentioned in a Resolution of the General Assembly in relation thereto, passed at the present Session, making it the duty of the said Murphy to purchase all the materials necessary for said repairs, of the best quality and upon the lowest obtainable terms; to employ all the workmen and labourers necessary in the execution of the said work at not more than the usual wages, and generally to superintend the making said repairs and to faithfully guard and protect the interests of the State in relation thereto, and when completed, or from time to time, as may be required, to report to the Executive a full and particular account or accounts of the cost of all the materials and labour which may be found necessary to put said Warehouses in complete repair, as intended by the aforesaid Resolution of the General Assembly - provided the said Murphy shall agree to undertake said superintendance for a compensation of five hundred dollars, to be paid upon the completion of said repairs, and give Bond with satisfactory security in the penalty of \$6000 for the faithful performance of said security.

The Council met Present the same as on yesterday

Ordered that Geo. M. Alexander Esquire Engineer of the State, receive from James Howard Esquire, the instruments belonging to the State, which had been loaned to the late Doctor William Howard, and which is now in possession of the said James Howard Esquire, and his letter to the Executive.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Geo. M. Alexander on order five hundred and fifty dollars thirty Cents on account of expenses of the Survey of the Coast and Sounds between Cape Charles & Lewistown, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson on order seventy seven dollars for the purchase of firewood to be accounted for.

By the petition of John Hilton of Thomas, and a transcript from the Records of Montgomery County Court, it appears that the said John Hilton was fined by the said Court of November Term 1833,
