

The sum of five dollars for not serving a State Warrant. The Petitioner states that the said fine was imposed upon him for not obeying the requisitions of a State Warrant placed in his hands which he officiated in the Office of Constable; that during the whole time said warrant remained in his hands he was confined to the room of several indisposition so that it was utterly impossible for him to perform the duties required of him by said Warrant as will be seen by the certificate annexed to his petition. He further states that owing to his limited circumstances and long continued indisposition it would greatly distress his family to be compelled to pay said fine and Costs, he therefore prays to be released from said fine. And the facts stated by the Petitioner being supported by the certificate of the Physician who attended him and being recommended to Executive Clemency by many respectable Citizens of said County, we do hereby remit said fine.

By the petition of Capanna Burns it appears that she was fined by Montgomery County Court at March Term 1835, she was fined by the said Court the sum of sixteen dollars for selling a gall of Whiskey contrary to Law. The Petitioner states that in the summer of 1833 she obtained a license to retail Spirituous liquors, and that without intention of violating the authority of her license, she, upon one occasion sold a Gall of whiskey for which the aforesaid fine was imposed, which she states she is unable to pay without causing much suffering to her family, who are solely dependent upon her for their support, she therefore prays for a remission of said fine. And one other Judge paid Court and several respectable Citizens of said County having recommended her case to the favorable consideration of the Executive, we do hereby remit said fine.
