

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Anne Levack or order forty dollars for one quarter pension, due the first Instant.

Friday April 10th 1835.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Antoinet Pastor on account of a charge of forgery, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at June Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Pardon Record.)

Monday April 13th 1835.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Edward N Ferroll on account of Murder, of which he was convicted in St Marys County Court at March Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

Wednesday April 15th 1835.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Richard J Jones on account of disposing of Public Goods of the State who is entitled to his freedom with which he was charged by indictment in Anne Arundel County Court. (See Pardon Record.)

Monday April 20th 1835.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Mrs Bacon Treasurer of the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf & Dumb, or to his order one thousand and sixty nine dollars eighty one cents for support, tuition, clothing &c of indigent pupils of the State of Maryland, as provided for by Law, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Mrs Rebecca Horresh or order one hundred and eighty dollars for six months pension, due the first Instant.

Saturday April 25th 1835.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Richard J Brabber or order one hundred and twenty five dollars eighteen cents for his account of postage for one quarter up to the first Instant viz for the Executive \$108.83, for the Treasurer \$9.41, for the Librarian \$4.81, and for the adjutant General \$2.13 & amount allowed.

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to John J Stubbs, on account of arresting and imprisoning Sumner Ash and William Rattfee negroes, of which he was convicted in Dorchester County Court at April Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years. (This pardon granted the 26 Inst). (See Pardon Record.)
