By the petition of Samuel Gibson of Peter and William Harrison of Richard of Calvert County, and a transcript from the Record of Calvert County Court, it appears that a recognizance was entered into by said Lee negro in the sum of one hundred dollars, and by the said Richard Harrison and Samuel Gibson, in the sum of sixty seven dollars each for the appearance of the said said Lee negro, before Calvert County Court, at May Term 1834, and to keep the peace, and that the said recognizance was forfeited.

The petitioners represent that the said negro was at Court on Tuesday the second day of the said term and continued to attend Court during the Term, but that they were not aware of the necessity of bringing him into Court; that no presentment was made against said negro, and that they were unaware of their liability under said recognizance until called on by the Sheriff for the forfeiture, - they therefore pray for a remission of the said forfeiture. And two of the Judges of the said Court having recommended in compliance with the prayer of the petitioners, we do hereby remit said forfeiture.

By a transcript from the Record of Calvert County Court and a representation of James S. Morse for administrator of Joseph J. Wilson, it appears that a recognizance was entered into by Joseph J. Wilson and Martha Wilson, in the sum of one hundred dollars for the appearance of the said Joseph J. Wilson before Calvert County Court, at May Term 1834 to answer &c, and that the said recognizance was forfeited.

James S. Morse for administrator of said Joseph J. Wilson represents that he is informed and verily believes that said Wilson attended the said Court in obedience to said recognizance, but that not being informed of the necessity of presenting himself at the Clerk's Desk and having his attendance noted the said recognizance was forfeited; that said Wilson is dead leaving a wife three helpless children in a reduced situation. - He therefore prays for a remission of said forfeiture. And two of the Judges of said Court having recommended said remission, we do hereby remit the same. James Thomas
