

By the petition of Wilson & Cuswall, and a transcript from the Records of Montgomery County Court, it appears that a recognizance was entered into by John G. Cuswall, in the sum of two hundred dollars, and by Philip Cuswall, the said Wilson & Cuswall and Gustavus Cuswall, in the sum of sixty dollars each, for the appearance of the said John G. Cuswall before Montgomery County Court at March Term 1834 to answer for, and that said recognizance was forfeited. The petitioner represents that previous to the said term the said John G. Cuswall left the State of Maryland and removed to the State of Ohio so that he could not be compelled to appear at the said John G. Cuswall as required by said recognizance. - he therefore prays for a remission of the said forfeiture. - and one of the Judges of the said Court having recommended the case to the favorable consideration of the Executive, we do hereby remit said forfeiture.
