

His Excellency the Governor granted a Pardon to Daniel Long, on account of Stealing, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at February Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for four years. (See Pardon Record)

Monday June 8th 1835

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Nicholas Waggoner, on account of Stealing, of which he was convicted in Frederick County Court at May Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to three years confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record)

Monday June 15 1835

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Washington Buckey, on account of an assault & Battery with intent to Kill and murder John Bender, of which he was convicted in Frederick County Court, at May Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to four years confinement in the Penitentiary. Friday June 19 1835.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to William Grant, on account of a charge of Felony pending against him in Baltimore City Court. (See Pardon Record)

Wednesday July 5 1835.

The following Demand was made, upon His Excellency the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, for the person therein named as a fugitive from Justice, upon the information and evidence therein mentioned, to-wit:

To His Excellency George Wolf, Governor of the State of Pennsylvania. Whereas a certain Samuel Ellis, a free man of colour, stands charged by Indictment of the Grand Jury of the State of Maryland, for Prince Georges County, with having on the thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three, at the County aforesaid, feloniously stolen, taken and carried away one Negro Woman of the Value of three hundred dollars, the proper Slave of Thomas W. Robinson, contrary to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, and against the Peace Government and dignity of the State of Maryland. And Whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Samuel Ellis, free man of colour, has fled from Justice, and is now residing in the State of Pennsylvania. It being important and highly necessary for the good of society that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to Justice. Now therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, by Virtue of the Authority Vested in me by the Constitution and
