By the petition of William Turner of Kent County, and a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears that he was fined by the said Court, at March Term 1835 the sum of seventy dollars for an assault & battery on Presley Brown.

The petitioner states that at the time of the trial before the said County Court, he was dangerously ill, and that his life was despaired of in consequence whereof he was prevented from furnishing his counsel with necessary information, and that he was also deprived of the testimony of Ebenezer Welch Esq. who was present at the time the alleged assault was made and witnessed the whole transaction, that instead of having committed the first assault the Deposition of P. W. Welch, which accompanied the petition, proves that Brown committed the first assault upon him, and that assault unprovoked, that at the time he struck said Brown with a pointed bottle the said Brown was advancing upon him with a Ball handle, and this too after Brown (who in physical strength is superior to the petitioner) had struck him first as aforesaid. He therefore prays for a remission of said fine. And the Deposition of Ebenezer Welch referred in said petition being in support of said statements, and sundry respectable Citizens of said County having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, we do hereby remit the same.

By the petition of James Kelly of Harford County, and a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears that the said Kelly was fined by the said Court at August Term 1833 five dollars, at August Term 1834 ten dollars, and March Term 1835 ten dollars for selling spirituous liquors without License.

The petitioner states that he is entirely without property and utterly unable to pay the fines and must continue in prison unless relieved from said fines, that he has a very large family of children most of whom are females and this condition actually subjects them to suffering. He therefore prays for a remission of said fines. And sundry respectable Citizens of said County having recommended the petitioner to Executive Clemency and also the said County Court. We do hereby remit said fines.
