

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council the following civil appointments were made, and commissions issued accordingly viz

Henry Wingate, a Notional Justice of the Peace of Charles County.

William W. Austin additional Justice of the Peace of Montgomery County.

Abel Sumner additional Justice of the Peace of Washington County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Nathaniel S. Williams or order two hundred and fifty, in dollars, for six months salary as a member of the Council, due the first ultimo.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Erasmus Harris or order two hundred and fifty dollars for six months salary as a member of the Council, due the first ultimo.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Doctor Dennis Claude, Jeremiah Hughes and George Wells Esquires, six thousand dollars appropriated for repairs and improvements to the public buildings within the State House Circle and the Walls and grounds surrounding the same and two thousand dollars for repairs of the Government House, and for enclosures about the grounds attached thereto.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Buchanan and Rev. J. Johnson or to their order, three thousand dollars for their services, embracing those of James Raymond their assistant, as revisors of the Laws of this State, under Resolutions of the General Assembly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay David Ridgely or order three hundred dollars, for services in examining the public Offices and collecting and arranging papers and documents, under Resolution no 44 of the last Session.

Ordered that David Ridgely Esquire Librarian have the Furnace under the Library fitted up in a suitable manner and secured against danger of fire to the State House therefrom.

Ordered that the assistant General have one thousand Cartouch Boxes brought from the Army at Easton to the Army here and to direct the Army at Easton to have the field pieces, and all other Arms and accoutrements now at St. Michaels, Centerville or elsewhere on the Eastern Shore and not in the possession of any organized Corps, brought to the Army at Easton to be preserved.
