

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Major Howard order one dollar for packing boxes, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John A. Alexander Engineer order five hundred dollars on account of contingent expenses of survey for a new State Map - to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Assistant General, forthwith, ascertain from the proper Department at Washington the number of farms to which the State of Maryland is now entitled and also if an advance of the quota to which this State may be entitled for the present year will be advanced on requisition.

His Excellency the Governor granted a Volle Pardon to Benjamin Dunning, on account of a charge of having stolen fourteen fathoms of Harwar Rope Value fifty dollars, of which he was found Guilty in Baltimore City Court, but for which he had not been sentenced by said Court. (See Pardon Record.)

Saturday August 20th 1835.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Barnes or order debent eight dollars viz \$75 for publishing in the Chronicle sundry Laws, and \$3 for publishing notice for proposals for stone &c for public work, by order of the Executive in virtue of Resolutions of the General Assembly of account proved.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted the following Pardons viz-

To Elijah Merryman, on account of stealing a Cow, of which he was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court at October Term 1830, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years. (See Pardon Record.)

To Elijah Cable, on account of stealing a Gold Watch Seal of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at November Term 1829, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years. (See Pardon Record.)

To Edward Stinson, on account of stealing, for which he was convicted, in three several cases, in Baltimore City Court at November Term 1833, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for six years. (See Pardon Record.)
