

To John P. Chesley, on account of Forgery and Stealing, for which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at October Term 1832, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years.

To John W. Canby, on account of Stealing, for which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, at February Term 1832, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for four years. —

To James W. Cracken, on account of Stealing, for which he was convicted, in three several cases, in Baltimore City Court, at November Term 1830, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for six years.

To James Dutcher, on account of Stealing a Cask of which he was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court, at April Term 1829, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Lewis Caton or Order seventy nine dollars viz \$75 for publishing in the Borderer Sunday Laws by Order of the Executive in virtue of a Resolution of the General Assembly and \$4 for publishing a proclamation of a Congressional Election to fill a vacancy in 1834, by Order of the Executive as required by Law, pursuant proved.

The following Demand was made upon His Excellency the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania for the person therein named as a fugitive from Justice, upon application, and the information and evidence therein mentioned, viz.

To His Excellency George Wolf Governor of the State of Pennsylvania. Whereas a certain Charles McKee stands charged by the affirmation of Peter Royer of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland with having, at the said County of Frederick harboured and concealed a Slave of the said Peter Royer, contrary to the act of Assembly in such case made and provided. And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Charles McKee has fled from Justice and is now in Jail in Chambersburg in the said State of Pennsylvania, on account of said offence. And it being important and highly necessary for the good of Society, that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to Justice. Now, therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby demand
