The following commission and instruction was issued to the aforesaid Agent viz.

The State of Maryland, To Jacob Fringer Gentleman, one of the Constables of Frederick County, Greeting. Be it known, that reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence and honesty, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you my agent to receive from His Excellency the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, Charles McKee a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and I do hereby authorize and direct you upon receiving the said fugitive to bring him into this State, and convey and deliver him to the Sheriff of Frederick County, to answer for having, at the said County of Frederick, harbored and concealed a slave of the said Peter Royer contrary to the act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

By The State of Maryland, To the Sheriff of Prince Georges or any other County in this State, Greeting. Whereas, it appears from authentic documents, certified and transmitted to the Executive Department,
