Ferdinand Ludwig Brauns this day produced to His Excellency the Governor and Exequatur from the President of the United States recognizing him as Consul of His Majesty the King of Saxony for the Port of Baltimore and State of Maryland. Whereupon His Excellency ordered that the said act of Recognition be published in the Maryland Republican in Annapolis, and in the Patriot and Chronicle in Baltimore.

The following is the order issued by His Excellency Viz
The State of Maryland. To all whom it may concern.
Ferdinand Ludwig Brauns having produced to me an Exequatur signed by the President of the United States, and sealed with the Seal of the said State, recognizing him as Consul of His Majesty the King of Saxony for the Port of Baltimore and State of Maryland, — ordered that the said recognition be published for the information and Government of the people of this State.

Andrew Jackson, President of the United States of America.
To all whom it may concern. Satisfactory evidence having been exhibited to me that Frederick Ludwig Brauns has been appointed Consul of His Majesty the King of Saxony for the Port of Baltimore and the State of Maryland, I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges as are allowed to the Consuls of the most favoured Nations in the United States.
