

City of Baltimore, on the 8th & 9th days of August last. And whereas information has been received at the Executive Department of this State, that the said Leon Oyer has fled from Justice, and is now in Louisville in the State of Kentucky, and it being important, and highly necessary for the good of Society, that the perpetrators of such offences should be brought to justice. You therefore, James Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the United States, do hereby demand the said Leon Oyer as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and make known to your Excellency that I have appointed Henry Thompson, Member of the Executive Council, my agent to receive the said fugitive, and bring him to this State, having Jurisdiction of the said offence, that he may be brought to trial therefor.

In compliance with the requisitions of the Law, I herewith annex and produce to your Excellency a copy of the evidence upon which this Demand is founded: which I certify is authentic. Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this sixth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five, and of the Independence of the United States the sixtieth.

The following commission and instruction was issued to the aforesaid agent
By the State of Maryland, To Henry Thompson, Member of the Executive Council, Gentleman, Greeting. Well knowing that reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence and honesty, James Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland, have appointed you my agent to receive from His Excellency the acting Governor of the State of Kentucky, Leon Oyer, a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and I do hereby authorize you, upon receiving the said fugitive to bring him into this State, and convey and deliver him to the Warden of the Jail of Baltimore City and County, to answer for having been engaged, and participated in the Riots which took place in the City of Baltimore, on the 8th and 9th days of August last.
