Tuesday December 8 1835

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay George Washington or order, ninety one dollars six, seven cents for his salary as a member of the Council from the 1st of October to the 1st of January, inclusive.

Wednesday December 23^d 1835

The Council having been notified to meet this day, the Hon^{ble} Nathaniel S. Williams and Gwinn Harris attended in the Council Chamber.

Thursday December 24 1835

The Honorable Nathaniel S. Williams & Gwinn Harris attended in the Council Chamber. His Excellency the Governor arrived last evening at the Government House, where (he being indisposed) the Council will meet until otherwise directed.

Friday December 25 1835

His Excellency the Governor and the Honorable Nathaniel S. Williams and Gwinn Harris met at the Government House.

The Hon^{ble} George Washington having resigned his seat as a member of the Council, the board proceeded, agreeably to the requirements of the Constitution to fill the vacancy thus occasioned where Luke Pieman Esquire of the City of Baltimore was unanimously elected by Ballot. Ordered that the Clerk notify him thereof and request his attendance to qualify &c.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council the following civil appointments were made and commissions issued accordingly viz
