By the petition of James Smith, Alexander Buckmaster,  
Benjamin H Boyd, and James Sellorsell Jr and a transcript from  
the Records of Calvert County Court, it appears that they had entered into  
a Recognizance in the sum of ~~two hundred~~ <sup>one hundred</sup> dollars, each, together with  
Covington Fowler, in the sum of one hundred dollars, for the appearance  
of the said Covington Fowler before Calvert County Court, at October  
Term 1833 to answer for an assault & battery, and that the said Recognizance  
was afterwards forfeited. The petitioners state that the parents of the said Fowler  
are dead, and that he is helpless & orphaned to support, and was compelled to  
follow a seafaring life for his and their maintenance, and consequently  
could not make his appearance at the time required, but they state that  
at the last October Term of the said Court, the said Covington Fowler  
did make his appearance before the said Court, and was discharged from
