His Excellency the Governor yesterday granted the  
following Pardons and Poles Provisos, and commutation of  
Punishment. Viz

To Charles Herbert, a coloured man, a pardon, on account  
of stealing a chicken, of which he was convicted in Washington County  
Court at April Term 1835, and for which he was sentenced to two years  
confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record).

To Nathan Waring, a coloured man, a pardon, on account  
of receiving stolen goods, of which he was convicted in Prince Georges County  
Court at October Term 1831, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary  
for five years.

To Abraham Wilmer, a coloured man, a pardon, on account  
of stealing one gallon of Corn, of which he was convicted in Kent  
County Court at March Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced  
to the Penitentiary for two years.

To John Brooks, a coloured man, a pardon, on account  
of stealing to the amount of \$10.70, of which he was convicted in  
Baltimore County Court, in February 1828, and for which he was  
sentenced to the Penitentiary for ten years.

To George Crosswell, alias Croxall, a coloured man, a  
pardon, on account of stealing plated ware to the value of eighteen  
dollars, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court, in June  
1833, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years.

To Edward Dawson, a pardon, on account of a charge,  
of which he was convicted in Talbot County Court in November 1826,  
and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

To William Goodad, alias Rezin Worden, a coloured man  
a pardon, on account of stealing a pair of Old Boots and a pair of Old  
Shoes, of which he was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court, in April  
1831, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for ten years.

To George Hinshaw, a pardon, on account of an assault  
with intent to kill, of which he was convicted in Dorchester County Court
