To Neg'o Jenny, a free coloured woman, formerly the property of Thomas Cartton, a parson, on account of stealing wood, of which she was convicted in Frederick County Court, at December Term 1835, and for which she was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.

To Hicks Roubler, a Noble Prosequi on account of a charge of assault & battery on Thomas Lamb in charge, against him by Prementment in Anne Arundel County Court.

To John Tydings, a Noble Prosequi on account of a charge of murder pending against him by Indictment in Anne Arundel County Court.

To Owen Murphy, a punishment of the sentence of Death which had been pronounced against him by Anne Arundel County Court for a charge of Murder, for which he was convicted in said Court in January last, to confinement in the Penitentiary for eighteen years, one twelfth of said time upon low and coarse Diet. — (See Pardon Record)

This being the day prescribed by the Constitution for the Election of Governor, the Honorable Thomas Key of Cecil County, was, on Joint Ballot of both branches of the General Assembly, Elected to that office.
