Thursday January 28 1836

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to
James Wilson (free negro) for Stealing a Log of Wood of the Value of
6 1/4 Cents of which he was convicted in Queen Anne's County Court at
May Term 1834, and for which he was sentenced to two years imprison-
ment in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record.)

Friday January 29 1836

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

His Excellency the Governor this day appointed the following
Gentlemen his Aides de Camp viz
Henry Sage Esquire of Dorchester County, Thomas G Pratt
Esquire of Prince Georges County, William A Culany Esquire of
Charles County, and Joseph H Nicholson Esquire of Anne Arundel
County, and Commissions issued to each of them accordingly.

Saturday January 30 1836

The Council met. Present the same as on yesterday.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Quinn
Harris or order two hundred and fifty dollars for six months Salary
as a member of the Council due the first instant.

Monday February 5th 1836

His Excellency the Governor and Mr Henry attended, and
the Honorable Gabriel Harris, Councillor Elect appeared, and was
qualified as a member of the Council, by taking the Oath prescribed by
the Constitution and Laws of this State before William Glover Esquire
one of the State of Maryland's Justices of the Peace in and for Anne
Arundel County, and by repeating and subscribing a declaration
of his belief in the Christian Religion.
